<b>Student Visa Requirements : first confirm you need one from your country</b>		
More than 180 days	Bring a background check/criminal record issued within 60 days before arrival by the corresponding federal/national authority (e.g. FBI in the United States). For the visa, you must present a notarized translation done in Argentina or at the Argentine Consulate in your country.	
More than 90 days - “residencia temporaria”	At the Immigration Office in Argentina, within 30 days of arrival (Mercosur countries can bring it from the Argentine Consulate in their home country)

If you plan to use an international health insurance, it must meet the following minimum coverage requirements:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Medical benefits of a minimum of USD 150,000 per accident or illness;</li> <li>2. A deductible not to exceed USD 500 per accident or illness.</li> <li>3. Confirmation that medical costs are covered directly by the company and that the student will not be required to file for reimbursement for amounts exceeding the deductible.</li> <li>4. Repatriation of remains in a minimum amount of USD 7500.</li> <li>5. No coverage limits for pre-existing conditions.</li> <li>6. Coverage for mental health.</li> <li>7. Discounts in prescribed medication</li> </ol>
