

Blended Intensive Programs

BIPs are short, intensive programmes that use innovative ways of learning and teaching, including the use of online cooperation under Erasmus+ with cooperation of partner universities within Europe.

What is BIP?

During these blended intensive programmes, groups of students or staff as learners will undertake a short-term physical mobility abroad combined with a compulsory virtual component facilitating collaborative online learning exchange and teamwork. BIPs provide an opportunity to reach out to new groups of students, where mobility opportunities have been limited.

How to create BIP?



Number of institutions and students involved

- At least 3 universities from 3 different Erasmus program countries should develop and implement the BIP. Coordinator University could be host institution at the same time.
- **Minimum 10 participants should** travel to host university. SU has an organizational support up to 15 participants.



Duration of the Program

- Physical mobility from **5 days to 30 days** of programme duration
- No eligibility criteria is set for the duration of the compulsory virtual component but the combined virtual and physical mobility must award a minimum of **3 ECTS** credits for students.



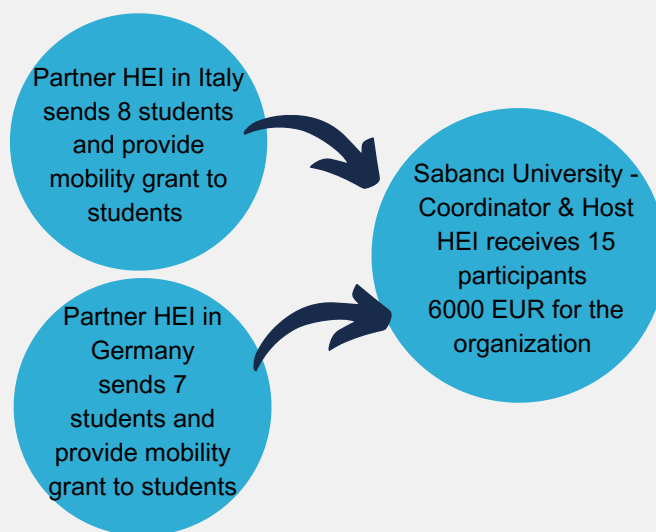
Funding

Coordinator University receive organizational support under Erasmus+ program. The Organizational Support (OS) grant for the receiving institution is based on following calculation: 400 EUR per participant with a cap on 6000 EUR.

Funding of Participants

Each participant should receive mobility grant from the sending universities. Sending university pays the grant from the Erasmus+ Student Mobility budget.

- Up to the 14th day of activity: 79 EUR per day
- 15th to the 30th day of activity: 56 EUR per day
