ELIGIBILITY FOR EXCHANGE

Inter-institutional agreement

There should be an inter-institutional agreement for Student Mobility for Study (SMS) between the home university and Wageningen University.

Registration

Exchange students should be registered as a regular student at one of the partner universities.

General course requirements

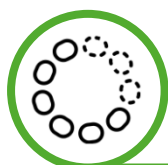
A minimum of 120 ECTS should have been completed before the exchange, which equals at least two years of study at the home university/academic background.

The application deadline is May 1st for students who start their exchange in September. For students who start in January or later, the application deadline is October 15th. Students have to be nominated for exchange by the coordinator from the home university.

HOUSING

Exchange students can only be nominated for housing through the exchange coordinators. Exchange students cannot submit a housing application with Student Housing. There is a limited amount of rooms reserved for exchange students.

As the amount of rooms at the housing office is limited, most EU students will need to find housing through the private market. In most cases housing is guaranteed for non-EU students because of immigration rules.



IMMIGRATION INFORMATION

For some incoming students, Wageningen University needs to apply for a MVV entry visa and/or residence permit(VVR) after admittance (students should not start procedures themselves). The International Office of the Student Service Centre (SSC) from Wageningen University will send the application for entry visa (MVV) and/or residence permit (VVR) to the immigration authorities (IND). The dues for this procedure are 311 Euros (2015). In this table can be checked which permit(s) are needed.
