

# Economics, Management and Digital Technologies applied to Cultural Heritage



# Environmental Management and Sustainable Development

The aim of this specialization track is to develop awareness of Sustainability concepts and issues, applied to the Environment and the Economy, learning about sustainable practices and management, adopting ethical and cultural approaches

#### Cities and Global Change

Focus on cities as places where human activities are concentrated, as the chief causes of, and solutions to, anthropogenic global change, providing students with a critical view of the nature of cities and social, economic, political, cultural global change.

#### **Environmental Humanities**






**Outcomes**


