Minimum language requirement	TOEFL 79 (internet-based test), IELTS 6.5 or Chinese Mainland's College English Test Band 6, if English is NOT the medium of instruction at your institution.	
Can students extend their exchange stint?	<p>Yes, but subject to approval of the home and host institutions.</p> <p>Application for re-admission should be raised before 1 May for Semester A enrolment and 1 October for Semester B enrolment to allow enough time to process the application and apply for extension of visa.</p>	
Activities or services available to exchange students (e.g. student activity group, student club, sports facilities, wellness centre etc.)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Exchange students may apply for associate membership and join the activities organised by the Students' Union at CityU • Student residence hall activities • Community service work organised by the University, e.g. City-Youth Empowerment Project • Access to campus facilities including library and medical centre, etc. <p><i>Note: Fees will be charged for some of the activities and services.</i></p>

Restricted programmes or courses (not open to exchange students)	<p>Some courses with capacity limit do not accept exchange students. For pre-requisite required courses, students must have taken courses considered equivalent to the pre-requisite.</p>
Medium of instruction and assessment	<p>The medium of instruction and assessment at CityU is English unless specified otherwise.</p>
Minimum and maximum number of credits to be taken for each semester	<p>12-18 credit units per semester. Exchange students must take full-time credit-unit load, i.e. at least 12 credits per semester in order to meet the visa requirements set by the Hong Kong SAR Immigration.</p>
Are students allowed to take cross-faculty modules?	<p>Yes, subject to approval by the course-offering department.</p> <p>However, exchange students attached to the College of Engineering (CENG) or the College of Science (CSCI) are required to take a minimum of 9 credit units from courses offered by departments of CENG or CSCI.</p>
Level of courses	<p>Exchange students are allowed to take courses at undergraduate level only (course level: B1-B4) unless approved otherwise.</p> <p>Normally, exchange students are not recommended to take postgraduate courses and the approval is case by case and subjected to course offering departments under CENG/CSCI. Postgraduate courses offered by other College/School will not be considered.</p>
Any special language courses for exchange students prior to the exchange programme stint?	<p>No.</p>

Are exchange students required to obtain a student visa?	<p>Yes. Details and procedures can be found at:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • http://www.immd.gov.hk • http://www.cityu.edu.hk/geo/ies_stdvisa.htm <p>Students are encouraged to apply for student visa to Hong Kong via CityU. CityU may act as local sponsor of exchange students who are accepted for admission and meet Hong Kong visa application requirements.</p>
Are exchange students allowed to work?	No. Exchange students are not allowed to work, whether paid or unpaid.

Recommended arrival dates	Semester A (tentative dates): 23 - 27 Aug 2021	Semester B (tentative dates): 3 Jan – 7 Jan 2022
Is airport pick-up service available?	Yes, scheduled shuttle bus service from Hong Kong International Airport to CityU Student Residence at Cornwall Street will normally be provided during the orientation week (Mon-Fri). Reservation is required.	
Orientation period	Semester A (tentative dates): It normally starts from the week before the semester commences.	Semester B (tentative dates): It normally starts from the week before the semester commences.
Cost of orientation programme (if any)	Most of the activities are free of charge, except for city excursions that will charge a modest activity fee.	

Insurance

Are exchange students required to purchase insurance?	<p>Yes. It is mandatory for non-local students (including exchange students) to have insurance.</p> <p>Students must purchase insurance for themselves before they come to Hong Kong. The insurance should include, but not limited to, medical and travel insurance that will cover the entire period of their study in Hong Kong. If they are unable to do so or wish to have additional insurance coverage, they may enroll in the 'Group Personal Accident Insurance & Medical Benefits Insurance Plan for Non-local Students' contracted by CityU. Private accommodation	<p>Private accommodation is expensive and limited in Hong Kong. It may cost around HK\$10,000 to HK\$15,000 for a two-room flat in some of the residential areas. Cost of Living	<p>Living costs will vary depending on individual lifestyle expectations. A basic student budget is estimated to be HKD 4,500 (per month) including meals, transport, laundry, and education expenses for books and stationery.</p>
